## A Word from the Youth Minister

It is currently 8:30 p.m. on a Sunday following a hectic, but fun last few days. Here is the abridged version.

On Friday, I left the high school at 3:30 p.m., and within the next half hour, a handful of my leaders and I headed down Highway 37 with 48 students, destined for Winter Jam at JQH Arena in Springfield. Winter Jam is a nationwide Christian concert tour. Some of the headliners included Matthew West, Katy Nicole, Hulvy and Chris Tomlin. JQH Arena has a capacity of about 11,000 and very few of those seats were empty. In addition to hearing great music, speaker Zane Black presented the gospel message to the room. The event concluded and we loaded our 48 students back onto the buses (didn't lose a single one). I managed to make it to bed by an early 2:00 a.m. Saturday.

On Saturday, I was up and moving and back to Springfield by 11:00 a.m. to coach my son's soccer game. We didn't manage to take home a win, but I did earn my first sunburn of the season. After the soccer game, we rushed back to Cassville to open up the Family Life Center and prep for our GIC event which began at 5:00 p.m. The GIC event was a blast. Our students got to hear from Scott Brawner. Using his story, he challenged our students. Scott scaffolded the students through the idea that what they believed would determine who they are, who they are would determine what they would do and what they do would determine who they would become. The point was that God has called us all to answer His call to action. We are not meant to only listen to and hear God's Word, but to do what the Word of God says. I appreciate Scott very much for the message and the challenge he brought. Afterwards, we all ate and fellowshiped together before moving into the gym for two hours of laser tag and battle bows. Scott took a quick liking to battle bows and showed a high aptitude for the game. No students were permanently harmed.


This was my weekend. It was busy. I am tired, sunburned and most likely dehydrated. But, it was also fun and spiritually challenging.
